This rare survival is in Saint Nicholas' Cathedral in Newcastle. It dates back to the 15th Century.

In the time after the Reformation images of Jesus, Our Lady, and the Saints were broken and smashed.

This one of Our Lady suckling the child Jesus probably escaped destruction because it is so small.

In modern times it was re-located in a window in Saint Margaret's Chapel in the Cathedral with some other ancient fragments formed into a roundel.
